Hoover Presidential Foundation to Host Webinar with Civil Rights Icon

WEST BRANCH, IOWA – July 6, 2020 – The Hoover Presidential Foundation will host a free webinar on Thursday, July 16 featuring author and scholar, Dr. Terrence Roberts. Roberts is perhaps best known as one of the Little Rock Nine, a group of African-American students who, in 1957, were the first black students ever to attend classes at Little Rock Central High School in Little Rock, Arkansas. Dr. Roberts shares his experiences and thoughts on racism in America.

The event will be moderated by Elizabeth Dinschel, Archivist and Education Specialist at the Herbert Hoover Presidential Library and Museum. The webinar is part of the Foundation's *3rd Thursday at Hoover's* program and will be conducted on the Zoom platform. The program will begin at 6 p.m. and advance registration is required. Participants will be able to submit questions through the Q & A feature.

Partners in the program include the Herbert Hoover Presidential Library and Museum, the Herbert Hoover National Historic Site, the West Branch Public Library, and the Urbandale Public Library.
